That's right: Regardless of your family income, you won't pay tuition at CCRI.

Eligibility for Rhode Island Promise 2018

- Rhode Island residents.
- 2018 high school graduates (public, private or homeschooled) or GED® recipients younger than 19 years old.*

How to maintain the scholarship for two years

- Enroll full time.
- Maintain at least a 2.5 GPA.
- Earn 30 credits each year.
- Enroll each semester for two years. Fall and spring are required.

**Students who graduated from high school at ages 19, 20 or 21 may be eligible if there is a documented reason for late graduation.*

Submit mid-year high school transcript and other relevant test scores	February/March 2018	Strongly recommended to ensure the best course placements	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Please go to: webfor.ccri.edu/hstrans • Upload your mid-year HS transcript, and SAT, ACT or GED® scores (please see your HS or GED® guidance counselor with any questions). • This step is strongly recommended to ensure the best course placements and the fastest path to graduation.
Take the ACCUPLACER placement exam	February/March 2018	Aug. 8, 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Call CCRI Advising and Counseling at 401-825-1240 to schedule an appointment for your placement test. • Information about the test and prep available online at ccri.edu/advising.
Submit final official high school or GED® transcript	June/July 2018	Aug. 8, 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Each transcript must be submitted in a signed, sealed envelope to CCRI’s Office of Enrollment Services at any campus or submitted directly to CCRI by your high school guidance counselor.
Register for Fall 2018 courses	April/May/June 2018	Aug. 15, 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Once you have taken the ACCUPLACER, you will be scheduled for a New Student Registration session where you will meet with an advisor, develop an education plan and register for courses. • Registration opens April 9, 2018.
Complete the FAFSA verification process if selected to do so	As soon as you are selected for verification	Aug. 31, 2018	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Some students are randomly selected for FAFSA verification. • If you are selected for verification, you will be asked to provide specific documentation to confirm that the information on your FAFSA is correct. • Call CCRI Financial Aid at 401-825-2468.
