#### Things to consider...

What motivated people to come to the New World?
How did settlers coming to the New World impact the Native people?
What did settlers bring from England to the new settlement and the Native people?
What challenges did the settlers in Jamestown face and overcome?

#### **Options, Options, Options! (Individual products)**

- 1. Make a Google slide presentation (5 slide minimum)
- 2. Write a diary/journal in the role of a settler (5 entry minimum)
- 3. Write a postcard exchange between a settler and a relative back home in England (5 postcard minimum)
- 4. Create a scrapbook with original drawings and captions (5 page minimum)
- 5. Make a pamphlet or brochure advertising the New World
- 6. Design a newspaper employment page for colonial jobs (5 advertisement minimum)
- 7. Create a museum exhibit with objects/illustrations/artifacts with descriptions (5 artifact minimum)

## Options, Options! (group products) (4 members maximum per group)

- 8. Write and perform a skit
- 9. Hold a mock court case
- 10. Have a panel discussion of "experts"
  - I will meet with all students selecting a group project to clarify expectations.
